The seller had hired an appraiser one year prior, and they totally mislead her into thinking the car was worth twice+ its real market value. As a result she wasted her time & effort sending it to auction with an unrealistic reserve.

The other issue is that these cars are so easily cloned from a garden variety Catalina. The difference in value, as we all know, is huge.

Where in VA would the valuation take place? Maybe I know someone who can help.
