

Our 1986 ¹/₂ Pontiac Grand Prix 2+2 Aerocoupe NASCAR SPECIAL

In 1983 Richard Petty wanted NASCAR to allow a modified Pontiac GP to run in the 'Cup Series" & in 1986 Pontiac finally released the "2+2 AeroCoupe". NASCAR required 200 minimum manufactured & available to the general public. Pontiac, in Canada, produced 1225 (1118 for U.S.A & 107 for Canada) "Aerocoupes" & only in 1986. A special aerodynamic nose & bobble rear glass made for a better "Super Speedway" race car for NASCAR drivers (Richard Petty's #43 STP, Rusty Wallace who won his first NASCAR race in the #27 Alugard Pontiac AeroCoupe on April 6th 1986 at Bristol, & others). They came in only one color (silver over charcoal gray with gray interiors) & were called a "nooption car" (it came with all options). List price was \$17,800 & some dealers were selling at \$4,000 above list; only dealers in the Southeast had them to sell. We bought our AeroCoupe from the original owner with 27.894 miles & had it trailed down to us from Virginia. Everything is original except tires, battery, belts & hoses (everything works, including the clock).
